Part B: 6. The Local Plan is not legally compliant and is unsound

Legally Compliant : Questionable at the very least!

S20 (5)(c) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 requires that the Local Plan complies with a legal requirement to consult with the local community. Although, on paper, this may seem to have been achieved, there was a distinct lack of transparency in the early stages of revealing the plan. The initial Preferred Options Local Plan Consultation was timetabled to take place from the 5th December 2016 - 30th January 2017 (i.e. to include the Christmas and New Year period when many people are otherwise occupied). It was extended to the end of January after complaints that the Council were trying to push it through with little opposition. In reality, the letters were only sent out to the public on the 15th December and many were not received until the 19th, meaning two weeks had already elapsed before residents could even start to consider the document which was complex and lengthy. No public meetings to disseminate information were organised by the Labour Council. It was left to a small number of opposition councillors who took the initiative to inform residents as to what was happening.

The Local Plan Scoping Consultation Document 2016 should have been published as part of the additional documentation to the Preferred Options plan as this focussed on Green Belt and many

3. Job losses if Agricultural land is developed. The loss of grade 1 and 2 Agricultural land that comprises most Allocated and Safeguarded sites has been ignored yet this will result in loss of jobs and a loss to the local economy from the produce they create

The Plan is Not effective

1. **The Infrastructure plan (IDP) and LPA07 & LPA08 are not effective.** The proposals put forward in the Draft Local Plan would create massive increase in vehicles on already congested roads. The IDP concentrates on projects that are already under way rather than how it would mitigate and fund the future issues that the Local Plan would create. For instance, the current Windle Island Junction scheme due for completion in 2019 at a cost of £7m, is aimed at easing congestion at the junction between the A580 and A570 - a well known bottle neck. In reality, although there will be some immediate improvement it is unlikely to fully solve the problem. There will be even greater traffic flow at that junction from HGV's once Liverpool's Super Port becomes fully operational together with traffic from the ever increasing number of warehouses being built along the A580 corridor and from the developments planned for neighbouring West Lancashire. Add to this the potential additional 2000 vehicles that could arise if 'safeguarded' site HS8 is developed with a knock on effect to the local roads such as Bleak Hill and Rainford Road and the area will be gridlocked. Although the IDP refers to some of these issues it does not detail how these problems will be resolved or funded. Many of the solutions are quoted as TBC. At best, the plan is aspirational.
2. **The St Helens Local plan is broadly one-dimensional.** It relies on private developers and a buoyant housing market to achieve its objective. However what happens if all these proposed houses fail to sell? If the economy takes a downturn what commitment would those developers have to St Helens. The employment opportunities all seem to revolve around Warehousing and logistics and it fails to address other types of job creation. In other areas where Warehouses have been built companies have relocated to fill them but also brought with them their own staff creating minimal employment opportunities for the local community. Warehousing also requires vast amounts of land which seems mainly to be earmarked for Green Belt in the Local Plan. If the Warehouses remain unused that Green belt has been wasted. Under the NPPF Green belt release should only be allowed in exceptional circumstances. Those exceptional circumstances have not been proven.

The Plan is not Consistent with national policy:

1. **It does not put use of Brownfield first:** The plan cannot be said to be consistent with national policy. The framework recommends use of Brownfield first to help regenerate urban areas but the Local Plan seems to be concentrating on use of Green Belt by arguing there is not enough of the former to meet demand. Due to the industrial history of St Helens there are many hectares of derelict Brownfield land that are in need of regeneration but if development is allowed to use Green Belt first then regeneration and economic growth will not occur.
2. **The Green Belt Review methodology is developer led.** The methodology for determining which sites should be released is flawed. It is using a developer led system rather than approaching it on a case by case basis. The process appears to have started by asking land owners to come forward if they were willing to sell and then looking for speculation advance by developers. Using the 2018 Green Belt review the 5 key purposes of Green Belt seem to have been assessed to fit in with those areas showing developer interest (as illustrated in my earlier comments under Green Belt methodology). Using that method conflicts totally with Green Belt purpose 5 (Ch 13 s134 NPPF): *'to assist in the urban regeneration by encouraging the recycling of derelict and urban land'*. Developers should not touch Green Belt land whilst Brownfield sites are available.
3. **The Infrastructure development plan is poor and incomplete.** It addresses current problems and areas where mitigation is already taking place but although it lists a lot of the perceived future threats to highways, education, health etc. it gives only vague ideas on how they would be dealt with and funded. This is not consistent with national policy

Based on the reasons I have given above the Local Plan has **NOT** been: Positively Prepared, Justified or Effective and is not consistent with national policy. **It is NOT SOUND.**

Part B: 7. To make the plan sound:

- Use the standard method for determining housing need to avoid unrealistic targets
- Investigate ways of decontaminating some of the lower quality Brownfield sites to enable them to be brought onto the Brownfield register
- There is no requirement to have 'safeguarded' land in the Plan. The NPPF states 'only where necessary' and the plan has not shown it is necessary. Such sites should stay in Green belt.
- The Infrastructure Plan is incomplete and superficial. In particular, it does not address how the local transport system would deal with all of the additional traffic (commercial and residential) or who would fund the new roads. Other aspects of infrastructure (e.g. educational establishments, local amenities, health etc.) need much greater research and explanation for mitigation and funding.
- Investigate other employment opportunities that could be brought to St Helens rather than concentrating purely on Warehousing and Logistics which are unlikely to generate sufficient employment options for local people.
- I do not believe the exceptional circumstances to justify release of green belt land have been shown. The methodology that was used for determining which parcels of land should be released does not conform to NPPF. It appears to be a developer led criteria rather than an objective test of the 5 purposes. Other reasonable alternatives have not been fully explored including lower target figures and using more previously developed land. These alternatives will have less impact on the environment and reduce the need for new infrastructure.

SHBC should amend the plan by retaining the Green Belt, reducing the housing and employment targets and allocating more previously developed land.







Green Belt, is more vulnerable to development without the protection of an up to date, adopted local plan.

The Submission Draft, in some policy areas, fails to meet the tests of soundness as set out in paragraph 35 of the National Planning Policy Framework (February 2019) (NPPF):

- a) Positively prepared – In fact too positive, leading to over-planning for jobs and housing.
- b) Justified – jobs and housing numbers are over estimated and more brownfield reuse is possible, these combined would erode 'exceptional circumstances';
- c) Effective – the policies would be more effective if the site allocations were based on a brownfield preference.
- d) Consistent with national policy – there are some policies that conflict with the NPPF, 2018 such as Section 11: Making the most effective use of land.

Policy LPA04 Strategic Employment Sites

I am strongly opposed to Green Belt land release for employment use. The Council has identified that at least 215.4 hectares of new employment land should be developed in St Helens, I regard this as unjustly excessive. I believe realism must be applied and the use of up to date data is recommended. The projections for job growth across office (B1), manufacturing (B2) and warehousing/distribution (B8) are unlikely to bear out in reality. This would cause an over-supply of employment property and have an adverse effect on the property market. It would lead to widespread vacancies.

Dr. Glenn Athey, economist concludes that there is a lack of transparency over the process that the Oxford Economics Forecasts have used when determining both the joint Liverpool City Region Combined Authority (LCRCA) and St Helens borough (St Helens) planning policies. Documentation would suggest that these forecasts are 'policy-led' and not 'objectively assessed', and are, in any case out of date – along with several other assumptions underpinning employment land policies, including forecasts of port freight. Considering Dr Athey's expert opinion, the Council should review the evidence as it is in the public interest to see a proper and transparent process for identifying objectively assessed need has been used. The continuing global uncertainties, exacerbated by Brexit, and more pessimistic medium and long term scenarios should be factored in properly.

Taking into account the fact that all the surrounding geography in Liverpool City Region, Greater Manchester and Cheshire is simultaneously planning for growth. There is no obvious source of people to take up the jobs in St Helens. Table 2.1 Labour Market Indicators in St Helens Borough shows unemployment in St Helens is low when compared to the rest of the North West and England, at only at 3.6% compared to 5.1% and 4.3% respectively. Workers are returning to European countries and the Government is not allowing for an increase in immigration from non-EU countries, so it does remain puzzling as to where the employees for the jobs would come from.

It would be grossly negligent for the Council to allocate too much farmland, which is important for future food security, and is currently protected by Green Belt designation based on economic analysis that is flawed and consequently not fully justified. Furthermore, it would be contrary to the Council's intention to "support proposals to help diversify the rural economy, including through the re-use of suitable buildings in rural areas for appropriate employment uses, subject to other policies in the Plan", which is supported. I am concerned about the negative impacts to the local rural economic sectors, and not least the gross value added to the entire North West Region as the food and drink sector is a growth sector and involves many businesses, and jobs directly, and indirectly.

What is the local benefit of B8 Warehousing formats with new technology replacing human resources, there has already been considerable B8 development achieved speculatively at Florida Farm and Haydock Park, and in neighbouring authorities, questioning the need for such an excessive amount in the countryside? The duty to cooperate has been non-existent on the cumulative harm from such big intrusions in Green Belt in neighbouring authorities causing sprawl along the M6, M61 and M62 motorways. Despite calls for action to the Secretary of State from local MPs, the harm has not been addressed by the Ministry for Housing, Communities and Local Government. We should be moving forwards in accordance with promises by Government to protect Green Belt.

Policy LPA04.1: Strategic Employment Sites

I am opposed to needless release of Green Belt land for employment uses

Planning applications for development within a Strategic Employment Site should be supported by a comprehensive masterplan covering the whole Site, which must set out details of at least a) to j).

Policy LPA05: Meeting St.Helens Borough's Housing Needs

Research shows that housing assessments produced by local authorities (SHMAs) are inaccurate, inflated and unreliable. The housing figures produced by SHMAs are not being balanced with sensible planning for infrastructure, consideration of environmental constraints, and realistic assessments of what housebuilders will be able to deliver.

The Government in July, 2018 introduced stringent Housing Delivery Tests, which Councils are to be assessed against. If they fail, it results in more countryside land being approved for development. So, now it is even more incumbent on Council's not to plan for one single house too many, as if the housing industry lacks capacity, or stops building due to poor market conditions, the public is penalised if the council is assessed as having failed, and more beloved countryside will be lost to development. Government repeats brownfield first encouragement, and promises continued Green Belt protection.

The Government has a growth policy for housing, and in National Planning Policy Framework Section 5 it sets out local planning authorities "to determine the minimum number of homes needed, strategic policies should be informed by a local housing need assessment, conducted using the standard method in national planning guidance – unless exceptional circumstances justify an alternative approach which also reflects current and future demographic trends and market signals.

Speaking in a parliamentary debate, Mr. Malthouse stated that any planning inspector will accept a "properly evidenced and assessed variation" from the target, adding "If, for example, you have constraints like areas of outstanding natural beauty or Green Belt or whatever it might be, and you can justify a lower number, then an inspector should accept that". These words should allow St Helens, with its important Green Belt setting, to make the case for lower housing numbers.

The Government should rely on relevant and up to date evidence, as it sets out as a general requirement of national planning policy, as explicitly stated in NPPF, 2018, paragraph 31 of the that the "preparation and review of all policies should be

Despite calls for action to the Secretary of State from local MPs, the harm has not been addressed by the Ministry for Housing, Communities and Local Government. We should be moving forwards in accordance with promises by Government to protect Green Belt.

Green Belt, is more vulnerable to development without the protection of an up to date, adopted local plan.

The Submission Draft, in some policy areas, fails to meet the tests of soundness as set out in paragraph 35 of the National Planning Policy Framework (February 2019) (NPPF):

- a) Positively prepared – In fact too positive, leading to over-planning for jobs and housing.
- b) Justified – jobs and housing numbers are over estimated and more brownfield reuse is possible, these combined would erode 'exceptional circumstances';
- c) Effective – the policies would be more effective if the site allocations were based on a brownfield preference.
- d) Consistent with national policy – there are some policies that conflict with the NPPF, 2018 such as Section 11: Making the most effective use of land.

Policy LPA03: Development Principles

I support Policy LPA03: Development Principles, places should be inclusive and deprivation should be alleviated in the future. Like my comments to LPA01 and LPA02 I am greatly concerned that by including unjustified, unrealistic jobs and housing requirements it will not be able to fulfil this policy. The Government's NPPF penalises Councils in cases where they are deemed to have failed to meet "Objectively Assessed Needs". Therefore, it is imperative St Helens is not saddled with unreasonably high jobs or housing requirements.

Policy LPA04 Strategic Employment Sites

I am strongly opposed to Green Belt land release for employment use. The Council has identified that at least 215.4 hectares of new employment land should be developed in St.Helens, I regard this as unjustly excessive. I believe realism must be applied and the use of up to date data is recommended. The projections for job growth across office (B1), manufacturing (B2) and warehousing/distribution (B8) are unlikely to bear out in reality. This would cause an over-supply of employment property and have an adverse effect on the property market. It would lead to widespread vacancies.

Dr. Glenn Athey, economist concludes that there is a lack of transparency over the process that the Oxford Economics Forecasts have used when determining both the joint Liverpool City Region Combined Authority (LCRCA) and St Helens borough (St Helens) planning policies. Documentation would suggest that these forecasts are 'policy-led' and not 'objectively assessed', and are, in any case out of date – along with several other assumptions underpinning employment land policies, including forecasts of port freight. Considering Dr Athey's expert opinion, the Council should review the evidence as it is in the public interest to see a proper and transparent process for identifying objectively assessed need has been used. The continuing global uncertainties, exacerbated by Brexit, and more pessimistic medium and long term scenarios should be factored in properly. Taking into account the fact that all the surrounding geography in Liverpool City Region, Greater Manchester and Cheshire is simultaneously planning for growth. There is no obvious source of people to take up the jobs in St Helens. Table 2.1 Labour Market Indicators in St Helens Borough shows unemployment in St Helens is low when compared to the rest of the North West and England, at only at 3.6% compared to 5.1% and 4.3% respectively. Workers are returning to European countries and the Government is not allowing for an increase in immigration from non-EU countries, so it does remain puzzling as to where the employees for the jobs would come from.

It would be grossly negligent for the Council to allocate too much farmland, which is important for future food security, and is currently protected by Green Belt designation based on economic analysis that is flawed and consequently not fully justified. Furthermore, it would be contrary to the Council's intention to "support proposals to help diversify the rural economy, including through the re-use of suitable buildings in rural areas for appropriate employment uses, subject to other policies in the Plan", which is supported. I am concerned about the negative impacts to the local rural economic sectors, and not least the gross value added to the entire North West Region as the food and drink sector is a growth sector and involves many businesses, and jobs directly, and indirectly.

What is the local benefit of B8 Warehousing formats with new technology replacing human resources, there has already been considerable B8 development achieved speculatively at Florida Farm and Haydock Park, and in neighbouring authorities, questioning the need for such an excessive amount in the countryside? The duty to cooperate has been non-existent on the cumulative harm from such big intrusions in Green Belt in neighbouring authorities causing sprawl along the M6, M61 and M62 motorways. Despite calls for action to the Secretary of State from local MPs, the harm has not been addressed by the Ministry for Housing, Communities and Local Government. We should be moving forwards in accordance with promises by Government to protect Green Belt.

Policy LPA04.1: Strategic Employment Sites

I am opposed to needless release of Green Belt land for employment uses
Planning applications for development within a Strategic Employment Site should be supported by a comprehensive masterplan covering the whole Site, which must set out details of at least a) to j).

Policy LPA05: Meeting St.Helens Borough's Housing Needs

Research shows that housing assessments produced by local authorities (SHMAs) are inaccurate, inflated and unreliable. The housing figures produced by SHMAs are not being balanced with sensible planning for infrastructure, consideration of environmental constraints, and realistic assessments of what housebuilders will be able to deliver.

Green Belt, is more vulnerable to development without the protection of an up to date, adopted local plan.

The Submission Draft, in some policy areas, fails to meet the tests of soundness as set out in paragraph 35 of the National Planning Policy Framework (February 2019) (NPPF):

- a) Positively prepared – In fact too positive, leading to over-planning for jobs and housing.
- b) Justified – jobs and housing numbers are over estimated and more brownfield reuse is possible, these combined would erode 'exceptional circumstances';
- c) Effective – the policies would be more effective if the site allocations were based on a brownfield preference.
- d) Consistent with national policy – there are some policies that conflict with the NPPF, 2018 such as Section 11: Making the most effective use of land.

Policy LPA03: Development Principles

I support Policy LPA03: Development Principles, places should be inclusive and deprivation should be alleviated in the future. Like my comments to LPA01 and LPA02 I am greatly concerned that by including unjustified, unrealistic jobs and housing requirements it will not be able to fulfil this policy. The Government's NPPF penalises Councils in cases where they are deemed to have failed to meet "Objectively Assessed Needs". Therefore, it is imperative St Helens is not saddled with unreasonably high jobs or housing requirements.

Policy LPA04 Strategic Employment Sites

I am strongly opposed to Green Belt land release for employment use. The Council has identified that at least 215.4 hectares of new employment land should be developed in St. Helens, I regard this as unjustly excessive. I believe realism must be applied and the use of up to date data is recommended. The projections for job growth across office (B1), manufacturing (B2) and warehousing/distribution (B8) are unlikely to bear out in reality. This would cause an over-supply of employment property and have an adverse effect on the property market. It would lead to widespread vacancies.

Dr. Glenn Athey, economist concludes that there is a lack of transparency over the process that the Oxford Economics Forecasts have used when determining both the joint Liverpool City Region Combined Authority (LCRCA) and St Helens borough (St Helens) planning policies. Documentation would suggest that these forecasts are 'policy-led' and not 'objectively assessed', and are, in any case out of date – along with several other assumptions underpinning employment land policies, including forecasts of port freight. Considering Dr Athey's expert opinion, the Council should review the evidence as it is in the public interest to see a proper and transparent process for identifying objectively assessed need has been used. The continuing global uncertainties, exacerbated by Brexit, and more pessimistic medium and long term scenarios should be factored in properly. Taking into account the fact that all the surrounding geography in Liverpool City Region, Greater Manchester and Cheshire is simultaneously planning for growth. There is no obvious source of people to take up the jobs in St Helens. Table 2.1 Labour Market Indicators in St Helens Borough shows unemployment in St Helens is low when compared to the rest of the North West and England, at only at 3.6% compared to 5.1% and 4.3% respectively. Workers are returning to European countries and the Government is not allowing for an increase in immigration from non-EU countries, so it does remain puzzling as to where the employees for the jobs would come from.

It would be grossly negligent for the Council to allocate too much farmland, which is important for future food security, and is currently protected by Green Belt designation based on economic analysis that is flawed and consequently not fully justified. Furthermore, it would be contrary to the Council's intention to "support proposals to help diversify the rural economy, including through the re-use of suitable buildings in rural areas for appropriate employment uses, subject to other policies in the Plan", which is supported. I am concerned about the negative impacts to the local rural economic sectors, and not least the gross value added to the entire North West Region as the food and drink sector is a growth sector and involves many businesses, and jobs directly, and indirectly.

What is the local benefit of B8 Warehousing formats with new technology replacing human resources, there has already been considerable B8 development achieved speculatively at Florida Farm and Haydock Park, and in neighbouring authorities, questioning the need for such an excessive amount in the countryside? The duty to cooperate has been non-existent on the cumulative harm from such big intrusions in Green Belt in neighbouring authorities causing sprawl along the M6, M61 and M62 motorways. Despite calls for action to the Secretary of State from local MPs, the harm has not been addressed by the Ministry for Housing, Communities and Local Government. We should be moving forwards in accordance with promises by Government to protect Green Belt.

Policy LPA04.1: Strategic Employment Sites

I am opposed to needless release of Green Belt land for employment uses
Planning applications for development within a Strategic Employment Site should be supported by a comprehensive masterplan covering the whole Site, which must set out details of at least a) to j).

Increased development in this area is not sustainable on the grounds of increased traffic, pollution and unmanageable pressures on the local and surrounding infrastructure. Roads are in frequently gridlocked, often putting extra unpaid hours on the working week.

The proposal to remove this land from the Greenbelt for additional warehouse development has not factored in the estimated 6,715 additional vehicle trips per day, including 1,366 HGV trips per day that will be generated by the newly constructed sizeable inappropriate warehouse development on Florida Farm North (adjacent to this land), once it is fully operation. Using the Florida Farm North developer's own figures, that is over a 20% increase in traffic flow on the A580 and around an 8% increase on the A58. Haydock's and the surrounding area's limited infrastructure cannot possibly be upgraded to accommodate the level of increased traffic flow such a significant additional development is highly likely to generate.

The Council has already granted acutely contentious planning permission in the Greenbelt in respect of site 2EA – Florida Farm North. Residents have suffered enough.

There is no statement of common ground with neighbouring authorities.

Haydock is fast becoming a low paid logistics haven (penalised for its proximity to the motorway network) and it is also widely accepted that Haydock has reached gridlock, particularly the East Lancs Road where locals, commuters and visitors are suffering on a daily basis. We have suffered enough. The region's limited infrastructure cannot cope with any further development and will only succeed in bringing the area to a halt.

The visual impact from Liverpool Road/Garswood Road will be severe if this Greenbelt is removed to accommodate yet more warehousing would be an unnecessary additional incongruous feature on the landscape with a substantial disparity in scale with the surrounding houses. This will result in fields along Liverpool Road and A580 south being isolated and unviable, encouraging further development proposals to come forward on these sites in future years.

The increased industrialisation of this neighbourhood will make Haydock a less attractive proposition to prospective home buyers, particularly in the areas suffering the greatest impact. This will in due course lead to a significant demise in resident turn over and will ultimately affect the demographics of the area. The long term knock on effects could be catastrophic for Haydock in many ways.

Noise is an underestimated threat that can cause a number of short- and long-term health problems, such as for example sleep disturbance, hormonal & cardiovascular effects, hypertension, poorer work and school performance, hearing impairment, etc. Noise has emerged as a leading environmental nuisance in the WHO European Region, and the public complains about excessive noise more and more often. Release of this Greenbelt for further unnecessary warehouse development is highly likely to create noise over and above WHO guidelines. This is a problem that will be further exacerbated in the evening and early hours i.e. noise and disturbance from vehicles entering and leaving site 24 hours a day and noise from reversing warnings on vehicles throughout the night. Traffic noise on the A58 Liverpool Road is already a big issue [REDACTED] near to the junction with the East Lancashire Road.

It is also worth noting the substandard and dangerous access via Calday Grove/Liverpool Road junction. Visibility for drivers is approximately half of that recommended as a **minimum** in local and national planning guidance (St Helens MBC's "Highways for Adoption – A Planning Guide" and "Places, Streets and Movement" DETR). Residents also face significant time delays and restrictions of access when leaving the site at peak times.

St Helens is already the second noisiest part of the North West according to data gathered by noise monitoring researchers Cirrus.

There's appears to be a Council perception of an overriding need for logistics in Haydock to serve St Helens and the wider city region, but St Helens Metropolitan Borough Council Draft SA/SEA Scoping Report December 2015 provides us with the following statistical information: Employment and economic activity in the borough - 4.80 Transport storage (logistics) is a major strength for St Helens, representing the highest proportion of employees in the whole of the North West (8.7%) of the workforce - 5,200 employees), almost double the national average.

Most of the logistics development is already in Haydock! This will mean that in St. Helens the economy will be even less diverse which is just the opposite of what it needs.

It is also worth noting that "The logistics industry across Europe is set to lose up to 40% of its low skilled workers due to the increasing cost effectiveness of robotic workers." "By 2020, robots are set to be considerably more cost effective than human labour." If the proposal is granted, within a few years we could be left with huge storage depots, lots of traffic congestion, no jobs and no green belt.

Releasing this Greenbelt for warehouse development will undoubtedly increase traffic congestion, increase air pollution, increase noise pollution and increase light pollution, and consequentially it will contribute to the irreparable damage of this habitat and its diverse flora and fauna, some of which are protected species.

The proposed site has substantial environmental interest and potential. The industrialisation of this locality will have an unacceptable adverse effect upon the environment and will change the nature and rural character of the area. Views of open countryside would be removed and there would be a detrimental impact on the openness of the Green Belt.

Road transport accounts for a significant portion of air pollution in cities and towns, causing serious pollution problems like carbon monoxide and smog. Should this Greenbelt be released for warehouse development there will be a substantial increase in the use of HGV's and other road vehicles. Road traffic pollution has to be considered a major threat to air in the local vicinity and beyond. Traffic fumes contain harmful chemicals that pollute the atmosphere and will unquestionably, particularly long term, be detrimental to health. Road traffic emissions also produce greenhouse gases that contribute to global warming, a trend that we as a society in general need to buck.

It is also worth noting that in 2013, St Helens was in the top 40 local authorities of 150 in the country for premature death rates for U75s. And **AIR** pollution in St Helens is responsible for almost 100 deaths per year according to a report published in January 2016. Public Health England (PHE) estimates that "outdoor air pollution is responsible for the equivalent of 98 deaths in St Helens per year", and the report adds: "This is equal to about a third of all deaths from respiratory illness and 5.5 per cent of all deaths in St Helens per year." It goes on to say that people in disadvantaged areas are more likely to be exposed to air pollution, so the issue contributes to the town's health inequalities. It says vehicle emissions, particularly from diesel cars, cause up to 90 per cent of the harmful pollution and adds that four areas of town are subject to regular air quality monitoring. It adds: "Although air quality has improved over the decades there have been no improvements since 2008." (Source: National League Table).

If air pollution is not given serious consideration, we will see an increase in respiratory conditions that will affect the borough's mortality rates for future generations.

"If there's at least a possibility that exposure to traffic pollution is having even worse health impacts than were previously known, then take the steps you can to reduce your dose as far as you can." Professor Barbara Maher 05/09/2016

Haydock does not need so many warehouses, the growth in the borough does not justify the extra warehouse building. There is no special circumstances that warrant Greenbelt release. The only benefit for releasing Greenbelt for development lies with the developer (maximise profit) and the council (income generated from business rates). It is a Local Plan that appears to be driven by developer's requests and not by local need. There is no benefit to residents. Just more misery.

The points raised throughout the Greenbelt Review (2018) clearly show inconsistencies with very subjective scorings and findings. It is almost as if some of the parcels of land have been pre-selected for safeguarding or discounted from the scoring, findings and rationale documented to produce the desired results.

The local plan is quite simply based on flawed employment forecasts and cannot be supported by historical facts.

Increased development in this area is not sustainable on the grounds of increased traffic, pollution and unmanageable pressures on the local and surrounding infrastructure. Roads are frequently gridlocked, often putting extra unpaid hours on the working week.

The proposal to remove this land from the Greenbelt for additional warehouse development has not factored in the estimated 6,715 additional vehicle trips per day, including 1,366 HGV trips per day that will be generated by the newly constructed sizeable inappropriate warehouse development on Florida Farm North (adjacent to this land), once it is fully operation. Using the Florida Farm North developer's own figures, that is over a 20% increase in traffic flow on the A580 and around an 8% increase on the A58. Haydock's and the surrounding area's limited infrastructure cannot possibly be upgraded to accommodate the level of increased traffic flow such a significant additional development is highly likely to generate.

The Council has already granted acutely contentious planning permission in the Greenbelt in respect of site 2EA – Florida Farm North. Residents have suffered enough.

There is no statement of common ground with neighbouring authorities.

Haydock is fast becoming a low paid logistics haven (penalised for its proximity to the motorway network) and it is also widely accepted that Haydock has reached gridlock, particularly the East Lancs Road where locals, commuters and visitors are suffering on a daily basis. We have suffered enough. The region's limited infrastructure cannot cope with any further development and will only succeed in bringing the area to a halt.

The visual impact from Liverpool Road/Garswood Road will be severe if this Greenbelt is removed to accommodate yet more warehousing would be an unnecessary additional incongruous feature on the landscape with a substantial disparity in scale with the surrounding houses. This will result in fields along Liverpool Road and A580 south being isolated and unviable, encouraging further development proposals to come forward on these sites in future years.

The increased industrialisation of this neighbourhood will make Haydock a less attractive proposition to prospective home buyers, particularly in the areas suffering the greatest impact. This will in due course lead to a significant demise in resident turn over and will ultimately affect the demographics of the area. The long term knock on effects could be catastrophic for Haydock in many ways.

Noise is an underestimated threat that can cause a number of short- and long-term health problems, such as for example sleep disturbance, hormonal & cardiovascular effects, hypertension, poorer work and school performance, hearing impairment, etc. Noise has emerged as a leading environmental nuisance in the WHO European Region, and the public complains about excessive noise more and more often. Release of this Greenbelt for further unnecessary warehouse development is highly likely to create noise over and above WHO guidelines. This is a problem that will be further exacerbated in the evening and early hours i.e. noise and disturbance from vehicles entering and leaving site 24 hours a day and noise from reversing warnings on vehicles throughout the night. Traffic noise on the A58 Liverpool Road is already a big issue [REDACTED] near to the junction with the East Lancashire Road.

It is also worth noting the substandard and dangerous access via Calday Grove/Liverpool Road junction. Visibility for drivers is approximately half of that recommended as a **minimum** in local and national planning guidance (St Helens MBC's "Highways for Adoption – A Planning Guide" and "Places, Streets and Movement" DETR). Residents also face significant time delays and restrictions of access when leaving the site at peak times.

St Helens is already the second noisiest part of the North West according to data gathered by noise monitoring researchers Cirrus.

There's appears to be a Council perception of an overriding need for logistics in Haydock to serve St Helens and the wider city region, but St Helens Metropolitan Borough Council Draft SA/SEA Scoping Report December 2015 provides us with the following statistical information: Employment and economic activity in the borough - 4.80 Transport storage (logistics) is a major strength for St Helens, representing the highest proportion of employees in the whole of the North West (8.7%) of the workforce - 5,200 employees), almost double the national average.

Most of the logistics development is already in Haydock! This will mean that in St. Helens the economy will be even less diverse which is just the opposite of what it needs.

It is also worth noting that "The logistics industry across Europe is set to lose up to 40% of its low skilled workers due to the increasing cost effectiveness of robotic workers." "By 2020, robots are set to be considerably more cost effective than human labour." If the proposal is granted, within a few years we could be left with huge storage depots, lots of traffic congestion, no jobs and no green belt.

Releasing this Greenbelt for warehouse development will undoubtedly increase traffic congestion, increase air pollution, increase noise pollution and increase light pollution, and consequentially it will contribute to the irreparable damage of this habitat and its diverse flora and fauna, some of which are protected species.

The proposed site has substantial environmental interest and potential. The industrialisation of this locality will have an unacceptable adverse effect upon the environment and will change the nature and rural character of the area. Views of open countryside would be removed and there would be a detrimental impact on the openness of the Green Belt.

Road transport accounts for a significant portion of air pollution in cities and towns, causing serious pollution problems like carbon monoxide and smog. Should this Greenbelt be released for warehouse development there will be a substantial increase in the use of HGV's and other road vehicles. Road traffic pollution has to be considered a major threat to air in the local vicinity and beyond. Traffic fumes contain harmful chemicals that pollute the atmosphere and will unquestionably, particularly long term, be detrimental to health. Road traffic emissions also produce greenhouse gases that contribute to global warming, a trend that we as a society in general need to buck.

It is also worth noting that in 2013, St Helens was in the top 40 local authorities of 150 in the country for premature death rates for U75s. And **AIR** pollution in St Helens is responsible for almost 100 deaths per year according to a report published in January 2016. Public Health England (PHE) estimates that "outdoor air pollution is responsible for the equivalent of 98 deaths in St Helens per year", and the report adds: "This is equal to about a third of all deaths from respiratory illness and 5.5 per cent of all deaths in St Helens per year." It goes on to say that people in disadvantaged areas are more likely to be exposed to air pollution, so the issue contributes to the town's health inequalities. The only benefit for releasing Greenbelt for development lies with the developer (maximise profit) and the council (income generated from business rates). It is a Local Plan that appears to be driven by developer's requests and not by local need. There is no benefit to residents. Just more misery.

The points raised throughout the Greenbelt Review (2018) clearly show inconsistencies with very subjective scorings and findings. It is almost as if some of the parcels of land have been pre-selected for safeguarding or discounted from the scoring, findings and rationale documented to produce the desired results.

The local plan is quite simply based on flawed employment forecasts and cannot be supported by historical facts.

Increased development in this area is not sustainable on the grounds of increased traffic, pollution and unmanageable pressures on the local and surrounding infrastructure. Roads are frequently gridlocked, often putting extra unpaid hours on the working week.

The proposal to remove this land from the Greenbelt for additional warehouse development has not factored in the estimated 6,715 additional vehicle trips per day, including 1,366 HGV trips per day that will be generated by the newly constructed sizeable inappropriate warehouse development on Florida Farm North (adjacent to this land), once it is fully operation. Using the Florida Farm North developer's own figures, that is over a 20% increase in traffic flow on the A580 and around an 8% increase on the A58. Haydock and the surrounding area's limited infrastructure cannot possibly be upgraded to accommodate the level of increased traffic flow such a significant additional development is highly likely to generate.

The Council has already granted acutely contentious planning permission in the Greenbelt in respect of site 2EA – Florida Farm North. Residents have suffered enough.

There is no statement of common ground with neighbouring authorities.

Haydock is fast becoming a low paid logistics haven (penalised for its proximity to the motorway network) and it is also widely accepted that Haydock has reached gridlock, particularly the East Lancs Road where locals, commuters and visitors are suffering on a daily basis. We have suffered enough. The region's limited infrastructure cannot cope with any further development and will only succeed in bringing the area to a halt.

The visual impact from Liverpool Road/Garswood Road will be severe if this Greenbelt is removed to accommodate yet more warehousing would be an unnecessary additional incongruous feature on the landscape with a substantial disparity in scale with the surrounding houses. This will result in fields along Liverpool Road and A580 south being isolated and unviable, encouraging further development proposals to come forward on these sites in future years.

The increased industrialisation of this neighbourhood will make Haydock a less attractive proposition to prospective home buyers, particularly in the areas suffering the greatest impact. This will in due course lead to a significant demise in resident turn over and will ultimately affect the demographics of the area. The long term knock on effects could be catastrophic for Haydock in many ways.

Noise is an underestimated threat that can cause a number of short- and long-term health problems, such as for example sleep disturbance, hormonal & cardiovascular effects, hypertension, poorer work and school performance, hearing impairment, etc. Noise has emerged as a leading environmental nuisance in the WHO European Region, and the public complains about excessive noise more and more often. Release of this Greenbelt for further unnecessary warehouse development is highly likely to create noise over and above WHO guidelines. This is a problem that will be further exacerbated in the evening and early hours i.e. noise and disturbance from vehicles entering and leaving site 24 hours a day and noise from reversing warnings on vehicles throughout the night.

It is also worth noting the substandard and dangerous access via Calday Grove/Liverpool Road junction. Visibility for drivers is approximately half of that recommended as a **minimum** in local and national planning guidance (St Helens MBC's "Highways for Adoption – A Planning Guide" and "Places, Streets and Movement" DETR). Residents also face significant time delays and restrictions of access when leaving the site at peak times.

St Helens is already the second noisiest part of the North West according to data gathered by noise monitoring researchers Cirrus.

There's appears to be a Council perception of an overriding need for logistics in Haydock to serve St Helens and the wider city region, but St Helens Metropolitan Borough Council Draft SA/SEA Scoping Report December 2015 provides us with the following statistical information: Employment and economic activity in the borough - 4.80 Transport storage (logistics) is a major strength for St Helens, representing the highest proportion of employees in the whole of the North West (8.7%) of the workforce - 5,200 employees), almost double the national average.

Most of the logistics development is already in Haydock! This will mean that in St. Helens the economy will be even less diverse which is just the opposite of what it needs.

It is also worth noting that "The logistics industry across Europe is set to lose up to 40% of its low skilled workers due to the increasing cost effectiveness of robotic workers." "By 2020, robots are set to be considerably more cost effective than human labour." If the proposal is granted, within a few years we could be left with huge storage depots, lots of traffic congestion, no jobs and no green belt.

Releasing this Greenbelt for warehouse development will undoubtedly increase traffic congestion, increase air pollution, increase noise pollution and increase light pollution, and consequentially it will contribute to the irreparable damage of this habitat and its diverse flora and fauna, some of which are protected species.

The proposed site has substantial environmental interest and potential. The industrialisation of this locality will have an unacceptable adverse effect upon the environment and will change the nature and rural character of the area. Views of open countryside would be removed and there would be a detrimental impact on the openness of the Green Belt.

Road transport accounts for a significant portion of air pollution in cities and towns, causing serious pollution problems like carbon monoxide and smog. Due to the undeniably vast increase in the use of HGV's whilst building and private cars that is highly likely to be generated by this unnecessary residential development, road traffic pollution has to be considered a major threat to air in the local vicinity and beyond. Traffic fumes contain harmful chemicals that pollute the atmosphere and will unquestionably, particularly long term, be detrimental to health. Road traffic emissions also produce greenhouse gases that contribute to global warming, a trend that we as a society in general need to buck.

It is also worth noting that in 2013, St Helens was in the top 40 local authorities of 150 in the country for premature death rates for U75s. And AIR pollution in St Helens is responsible for almost 100 deaths per year according to a report published in January 2016. Public Health England (PHE) estimates that "outdoor air pollution is responsible for the equivalent of 98 deaths in St Helens per year", and the report adds: "This is equal to about a third of all deaths from respiratory illness and 5.5 per cent of all deaths in St Helens per year." It goes on to say that people in disadvantaged areas are more likely to be exposed to air pollution, so the issue contributes to the town's health inequalities. It says vehicle emissions, particularly from diesel cars, cause up to 90 per cent of the harmful pollution and adds that four areas of town are subject to regular air quality monitoring. It adds: "Although air quality has improved over the decades there have been no improvements since 2008." (Source: National League Table).

The proximity of cycle paths (cyclists, joggers and walkers are all at risk) should be incorporated into all independent air pollution investigations and all independent air pollution investigations should be conducted during peak times and not in school holidays.

If air pollution is not given serious consideration, we will see an increase in respiratory conditions that will affect the borough's mortality rates for future generations.

"Air pollution is the grossest manifestation of a failure of UK transport planning to take the environmental impacts of transport choices sufficiently into account."

"Air pollution-related morbidity and mortality are at epidemic levels - and, although less obvious, are more significant than road transport collisions as a cause of death and injury."

"There needs to be a strong political and societal commitment to protecting public health, particularly the health of children, whose life chances can be seriously compromised by exposure to air pollution."

"Currently, air pollution is a shared priority between Defra and the Department for Transport, but shared priority does not mean equal priority. Transport policy and planning has instead prioritised safety and economic growth."

That pollution is estimated to shorten the lives of more than 50,000 people a year.

This is far higher than the number of deaths caused by traffic accidents (1,713 in 2013) - yet road safety is a much higher priority for planners than pollution, the researchers say.

The estimate for the UK is that 50,000 people die every year with conditions linked to polluted air and earlier this year the World Health Organisation warned that air pollution was leading to as many as three million premature deaths every year.

Air pollution was linked to a significant increase in the risk of Alzheimer's disease by a major study published in 2015, while other research showed brain damage related to Alzheimer's disease in children and young adults exposed to air pollution. Air pollution has also been linked to dementia in older men and women.

Air pollution is a global health crisis that kills more people than malaria and HIV/Aids combined and it has long been linked to lung and heart disease and strokes. But research is uncovering new impacts on health, including degenerative brain diseases such as Alzheimer's, mental illness and reduced intelligence.

Toxic nanoparticles from air pollution have been discovered in human brains in "abundant" quantities, a newly published study reveals.

"If there's at least a possibility that exposure to traffic pollution is having even worse health impacts than were previously known, then take the steps you can to reduce your dose as far as you can." *Professor Barbara Maher 05/09/2016*

Increased development in this area is not sustainable on the grounds of increased traffic, pollution and unmanageable pressures on the local and surrounding infrastructure. Roads are frequently gridlocked, often putting extra unpaid hours on the working week.

The proposal to remove this land from the Greenbelt for additional warehouse development has not factored in the estimated 6,715 additional vehicle trips per day, including 1,366 HGV trips per day that will be generated by the newly constructed sizeable inappropriate warehouse development on Florida Farm North (adjacent to this land), once it is fully operation. Using the Florida Farm North developer's own figures, that is over a 20% increase in traffic flow on the A580 and around an 8% increase on the A58. Haydock's and the surrounding area's limited infrastructure cannot possibly be upgraded to accommodate the level of increased traffic flow such a significant additional development is highly likely to generate.

The Council has already granted acutely contentious planning permission in the Greenbelt in respect of site 2EA – Florida Farm North. Residents have suffered enough.

There is no statement of common ground with neighbouring authorities.

Haydock is fast becoming a low paid logistics haven (penalised for its proximity to the motorway network) and it is also widely accepted that Haydock has reached gridlock, particularly the East Lancs Road where locals, commuters and visitors are suffering on a daily basis. We have suffered enough. The region's limited infrastructure cannot cope with any further development and will only succeed in bringing the area to a halt.

The visual impact from Liverpool Road/Garswood Road will be severe if this Greenbelt is removed to accommodate yet more warehousing would be an unnecessary additional incongruous feature on the landscape with a substantial disparity in scale with the surrounding houses. This will result in fields along Liverpool Road and A580 south being isolated and unviable, encouraging further development proposals to come forward on these sites in future years.

The increased industrialisation of this neighbourhood will make Haydock a less attractive proposition to prospective home buyers, particularly in the areas suffering the greatest impact. This will in due course lead to a significant demise in resident turn over and will ultimately affect the demographics of the area. The long term knock on effects could be catastrophic for Haydock in many ways.

Noise is an underestimated threat that can cause a number of short- and long-term health problems, such as for example sleep disturbance, hormonal & cardiovascular effects, hypertension, poorer work and school performance, hearing impairment, etc. Noise has emerged as a leading environmental nuisance in the WHO European Region, and the public complains about excessive noise more and more often. Release of this Greenbelt for further unnecessary warehouse development is highly likely to create noise over and above WHO guidelines. This is a problem that will be further exacerbated in the evening and early hours i.e. noise and disturbance from vehicles entering and leaving site 24 hours a day and noise from reversing warnings on vehicles throughout the night. Traffic noise on the A58 Liverpool Road is already a big issue [REDACTED] near to the junction with the East Lancashire Road.

It is also worth noting the substandard and dangerous access via Calday Grove/Liverpool Road junction. Visibility for drivers is approximately half of that recommended as a **minimum** in local and national planning guidance (St Helens MBC's "Highways for Adoption – A Planning Guide" and "Places, Streets and Movement" DETR). Residents also face significant time delays and restrictions of access when leaving the site at peak times.

St Helens is already the second noisiest part of the North West according to data gathered by noise monitoring researchers Cirrus.

There's appears to be a Council perception of an overriding need for logistics in Haydock to serve St Helens and the wider city region, but St Helens Metropolitan Borough Council Draft SA/SEA Scoping Report December 2015 provides us with the following statistical information: Employment and economic activity in the borough - 4.80 Transport storage (logistics) is a major strength for St Helens, representing the highest proportion of employees in the whole of the North West (8.7%) of the workforce - 5,200 employees), almost double the national average.

Most of the logistics development is already in Haydock! This will mean that in St. Helens the economy will be even less diverse which is just the opposite of what it needs.

It is also worth noting that "The logistics industry across Europe is set to lose up to 40% of its low skilled workers due to the increasing cost effectiveness of robotic workers." "By 2020, robots are set to be considerably more cost effective than human labour." If the proposal is granted, within a few years we could be left with huge storage depots, lots of traffic congestion, no jobs and no green belt.

Releasing this Greenbelt for warehouse development will undoubtedly increase traffic congestion, increase air pollution, increase noise pollution and increase light pollution, and consequentially it will contribute to the irreparable damage of this habitat and its diverse flora and fauna, some of which are protected species.

The proposed site has substantial environmental interest and potential. The industrialisation of this locality will have an unacceptable adverse effect upon the environment and will change the nature and rural character of the area. Views of open countryside would be removed and there would be a detrimental impact on the openness of the Green Belt.

Road transport accounts for a significant portion of air pollution in cities and towns, causing serious pollution problems like carbon monoxide and smog. Should this Greenbelt be released for warehouse development there will be a substantial increase in the use of HGV's and other road vehicles. Road traffic pollution has to be considered a major threat to air in the local vicinity and beyond. Traffic fumes contain harmful chemicals that pollute the atmosphere and will unquestionably, particularly long term, be detrimental to health. Road traffic emissions also produce greenhouse gases that contribute to global warming, a trend that we as a society in general need to buck.

It is also worth noting that in 2013, St Helens was in the top 40 local authorities of 150 in the country for premature death rates for U75s. And AIR pollution in St Helens is responsible for almost 100 deaths per year according to a report published in January 2016. Public Health England (PHE) estimates that "outdoor air pollution is responsible for the equivalent of 98 deaths in St Helens per year", and the report adds: "This is equal to about a third of all deaths from respiratory illness and 5.5 per cent of all deaths in St Helens per year." It goes on to say that people in disadvantaged areas are more likely to be exposed to air pollution, so the issue contributes to the town's health inequalities. It says vehicle emissions, particularly from diesel cars, cause up to 90 per cent of the harmful pollution and adds that four areas of town are subject to regular air quality monitoring. It adds: "Although air quality has improved over the decades there have been no improvements since 2008." (Source: National League Table).

If air pollution is not given serious consideration, we will see an increase in respiratory conditions that will affect the borough's mortality rates for future generations.

exceptional circumstances to exist and council has examined fully all other reasonable options for meeting its identified need for development.

Sustainable development can be described as 'economic development that is conducted without depletion of natural resources'. The NPPF states the *objective of sustainable development can be summarised as meeting the needs of the present, without compromising the ability of the future generations to meet their own needs*. The removal of such a large piece of Green Belt land in one area will have an unprecedented impact on the local environment and without exception lead to depletion of natural resources. This area in conjunction with other proposed land to be removed from Green Belt in close proximity will have such a significant impact on the natural environment that it can never be repaired. The impact on future generations cannot be disputed and removes the ability for them to meet their own needs.

Achieving sustainable development has three overarching objectives, economic, social and environmental.

The Council will argue they are building a strong, responsive and competitive economy by allocating some of this land for commercial warehousing opportunities. As well as limited in number, not reflecting the number of houses planned, warehousing employment is generally recognised as low skilled, minimum wage employment. Looking for opportunities in this sector is also not future proofing for future generations. The Guardian recently ran an article claiming automation will take 1 in 3 warehousing jobs in the UK's northern centres by 2030. The area is also already saturated with warehousing employment with significant warehousing expansion, as part of the Omega project, undertaken by the neighbouring Warrington Borough Council.

The Bold and Clock Face areas have also been identified as suffering from higher than average numbers of people living in poverty and deprivation. Whilst the Council have claimed the vast amounts of housing development in the area will improve life for these people, it has failed to demonstrate how the removal of this land from Green belt for housing will directly contribute to those individuals health, cultural and social well-being. It can be argued this plan will have a further detrimental effect on those individuals. Limited minimum wage employment will have little impact on their ability to further their prospects. It has also been recognised people living at the lower end of the economic scale suffer from increased levels of mental health problems. In addition there is a significant and growing body of evidence that time spent in nature, or even just looking at natural scenes, can reduce mental and physical health risks. Research has also found that children with conditions such as Attention Deficit Disorder and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, which are increasingly common, were found to have better concentration in natural environments. These points taken in conjunction demonstrate the potential for this vast amount of urbanisation of a natural environment to have a further negative effect. This is further supported by comments submitted to St Helens Council by Natural England in 2016, which raised concerns about the impact on people's ability to access established public footpaths and natural open areas throughout the Green Belt. They believed this would have a negative impact on the individuals health and well-being.

The environmental objective is to contribute to protecting and enhancing our natural, built and historic environment; including making effective use of land, helping to improve biodiversity, using natural resources prudently, minimising waste and pollution, and mitigating and adapting to climate change, including moving to a low carbon economy. The Group has conducted an assessment of the Local Plan and Green Belt Review, specifically in relation to this objective. Please see the assessment attached in its entirety. The assessment highlights the reasons why, even under the Councils own Green Belt Review, the land cannot be justified in removal from the Green Belt. These reasons include:

Sustainable development can be described as 'economic development that is conducted without depletion of natural resources'. The NPPF states the *objective of sustainable development can be summarised as meeting the needs of the present, without compromising the ability of the future generations to meet their own needs*'. The removal of such a large piece of Green Belt land in one area will have an unprecedented impact on the local environment and without exception lead to depletion of natural resources. This area in conjunction with other proposed land to be removed from Green Belt in close proximity will have such a significant impact on the natural environment that it can never be repaired. The impact on future generations cannot be disputed and removes the ability for them to meet their own needs.

Achieving sustainable development has three overarching objectives, economic, social and environmental.

The Council will argue they are building a strong, responsive and competitive economy by allocating some of this land for commercial warehousing opportunities. As well as limited in number, not reflecting the number of houses planned, warehousing employment is generally recognised as low skilled, minimum wage employment. Looking for opportunities in this sector is also not future proofing for future generations. The Guardian recently ran an article claiming automation will take 1 in 3 warehousing jobs in the UK's northern centres by 2030. The area is also already saturated with warehousing employment with significant warehousing expansion, as part of the Omega project, undertaken by the neighbouring Warrington Borough Council.

The Bold and Clock Face areas have also been identified as suffering from higher than average numbers of people living in poverty and deprivation. Whilst the Council have claimed the vast amounts of housing development in the area will improve life for these people, it has failed to demonstrate how the removal of this land from Green belt for housing will directly contribute to those individuals health, cultural and social well-being. It can be argued this plan will have a further detrimental effect on those individuals. Limited minimum wage employment will have little impact on their ability to further their prospects. It has also been recognised people living at the lower end of the economic scale suffer from increased levels of mental health problems. In addition there is a significant and growing body of evidence that time spent in nature, or even just looking at natural scenes, can reduce mental and physical health risks. Research has also found that children with conditions such as Attention Deficit Disorder and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, which are increasingly common, were found to have better concentration in natural environments. These points taken in conjunction demonstrate the potential for this vast amount of urbanisation of a natural environment to have a further negative effect. This is further supported by comments submitted to St Helens Council by Natural England in 2016, which raised concerns about the impact on people's ability to access established public footpaths and natural open areas throughout the Green Belt. They believed this would have a negative impact on the individuals health and well-being.

The environmental objective is to contribute to protecting and enhancing our natural, built and historic environment; including making effective use of land, helping to improve biodiversity, using natural resources prudently, minimising waste and pollution, and mitigating and adapting to climate change, including moving to a low carbon economy. The Group has conducted an assessment of the Local Plan and Green Belt Review, specifically in relation to this objective. Please see the assessment attached in its entirety. The assessment highlights the reasons why, even under the Councils own Green Belt Review, the land cannot be justified in removal from the Green Belt. These reasons include:

This continuation sheet is further to my Representation/Comment form. I find it necessary to use this continuation sheet because I find the format of the Comment Form too complicated and misleading to complete within the small spaces allocated.

I believe that this Submission Draft does not satisfy the requirement for sustainable development because the plan promotes increased car dependency, the housing targets are based upon outdated NPPF guidelines and are extremely aspirational, ignores the requirement to preserve food security by ignoring Agricultural Land Quality and the demand for green spaces as a community requirement.

The Plan is not legally compliant because:

As late as 12th December 2018 the Council Cabinet meetings stated that the Statement of Common Ground was still being prepared. Obviously this was too late for the preparation of the Local Plan and therefore the requirements of the plan making PPG para 054 have not been met. Not surprisingly it is lacking in evidence to demonstrate that it satisfies the Duty to Cooperate on the following matters:

Employment Land, Remediation of Brownfield land, Transport and Traffic, (including road infrastructure) and local amenities.

Employment Land: I am dismayed at the number of giant warehouses springing up along the A580, each needing HGVs to supply stock for disbursement and HGVs and LGVs to distribute to final destinations. I fear that many of these sites will fail to reach their planned potential, leaving a legacy of derelict sheds and wasted unoccupied land.

Brownfield sites: St Helens Council states that the cost of cleaning up the Brownfield sites of St Helens would cost £40 million. Monies were available via the Liverpool City Council for this purpose. I have not seen any report of the Council's effort to bid for these monies, successful or not.

Traffic Issues and Duty to Cooperate

St Helens MBC is a member of the Liverpool City Partnership and as such is privy to the planning issues being passed as the programme for the Northern Powerhouse is rolled out but continues to push ahead to please the developers, ignoring the views of the local residents. There is no obvious cooperation to provide an integrated transport plan between St Helens, Knowsley, Wigan or Warrington. Any employees would need to travel by private cars to the new business parks as there is no existing public transport or any published plans for the future.

The impending effects of the Superport at Bootle expansion means that there will be an explosion of HGV traffic to service the burgeoning warehousing between the M57 and the M6.

Already these units are advertising **DIRECT** access for HGVs to Liverpool and Manchester by using the A580 and passing Windle Island in both directions and the Council's plan to build 1027 new homes on 8HS states that there will be an access road onto the A580 by rerouting Houghtons Lane. This area has seen 3 fatalities recently and an estimated 1800 extra cars at peak times is not sustainable. The plans also show a planned route for walkers and cyclist along Calderhurst Road to Bleak Hill road where there is a traffic problem with school parking. I fear that these plans will be altered to allow access/egress for the new home residents.

As part of the Northern Powerhouse initiative, it is proposed to build 6000 houses 5 miles to the north of St Helens. These dwellings are contiguous to the A570 Rainford bypass and although they straddle the M58 motorway it is obvious that there will be peak time pressures on Windle Island as commuters seek access to west Manchester and east Liverpool.

As late as 12th December 2018 the Council Cabinet meeting stated that the Statement of Common Ground was still being prepared. Obviously this was too late for the preparation of the Local Plan and therefore the requirements of the plan making PPG para 054 have not been met. Not surprisingly it is lacking in evidence to demonstrate that it satisfies the Duty to Cooperate on the matters of Employment Land, Remediation of Brownfield land, Transport and Traffic, (including road infrastructure) and local amenities. ①

I believe that St Helens Council have not proved "exceptional circumstances" for removing land from Green Belt and I believe that the plan is not positively prepared, justified, effective or consistent with the National Planning Policy. ②

The Plan is not positively prepared because there is little or no evidence of agreements with other areas and by releasing Green Belt land unnecessarily; the plan does not achieve sustainable development. ②

The economic growth predictions, not just for St Helens, but for the neighbouring boroughs within the Liverpool City Region (LCR) are based on the flawed methodology nationally using NPPF Guidelines, ONS statistics (2016) instead of (2018) which do not take into account differing regional requirements. These dwellings are contiguous to the A570 Rainford bypass and although they straddle the M58 motorway it is obvious that there will be peak time pressures on Windle Island as commuters seek access to west Manchester and east Liverpool as up to 10000 cars (6000 x 1.8 national average car per household) could be involved. WEST LANC L.P. ③

St Helens MBC is a member of the Liverpool City Partnership and as such is privy to the planning issues being passed as the programme for the Northern Powerhouse is rolled out but continues to push ahead to please the developers, ignoring the views of the local residents. There is no obvious cooperation to provide an integrated transport plan between St Helens, Knowsley, Wigan or Warrington. Any employees would need to travel by private cars to the new business parks as there is no existing public transport or any published plans for the future. ②

Employment Land

The Oxford Economics transformational Growth forecasts (2016) are all quoted as being critical in informing assumptions about industry growth and the demand for employment land but are nowhere to be accessed despite formal enquiries being made to SHBC and the Liverpool City Region.

The Employment Land Needs Study addendum report (January 2109) states that "this modelling had input from St Helens Council in regards to promoted major development projects being considered in the preparation of the Local Plan Preferred Options, being focused on logistics and warehousing schemes, including potential Green Belt sites around Haydock, west of Omega and Parkside West and East"

If this statement is true, it means that the Council itself set the criteria for transformational growth including the use of Green Belt land is a subjective and aspirational scenario and not an objectively based needs assessment of economic and market trends.

It follows that SHBC have directly informed a set of economic aspirations which have become joint planning policy. **For this reason I believe that the plan has not been positively prepared.**

SHMBC must be aware of the extent of the aspirational numbers of jobs being promised by developers without any hard evidence of these jobs materialising eg The Amazon warehouse at Florida Farm promises many jobs, but the trade press heralds Amazon's recent acquisition of robotisation software to ensure efficiency and cost savings by reducing workplace numbers. I do not believe that the actual jobs created will match the number of jobs promised.

I am dismayed at the number of giant warehouses springing up along the A580, each needing HGVs to supply stock for disbursement and HGVs and LGVs to distribute to final destinations. The Council's plan to build 1027 new homes on 8HS states that there will be an access road onto the A580 by rerouting Houghtons Lane. The stretch of the A580 between Windle Island and the junction of Blindfoot Road only is 1.4 miles, with 3 intersections onto a busy crowded freeway. This area has seen 3 fatalities recently and an estimated 1800 extra cars at peak times is not sustainable.

PART B -YOUR REPRESENTATION

I firmly believe that the Submission Draft fails to meet the tests of soundness as set out in paragraph 35 of the National Planning Policy Framework (February 2019) (NPPF)

I believe that St Helens Borough Council ("the Council") has failed to meet legal and procedural requirements in preparing the Submission Draft and have provided no evidence that they have complied with their Duty to Cooperate. The Submission Draft is not positively prepared, justified, effective or consistent with National Planning Policy.

Please note that I am in agreement to the representations made by **St Helens Green Belt Association (SHGBA)** and **Eccleston Community Residents Association (ECRA)** but in addition I would also make the following specific points:

Duty to Cooperate

The Submission Draft provides no evidence that the Council have satisfied their Duty to Cooperate. There is no evidence that the Council has satisfied this legal requirement. The Council seems to be competing with neighbouring local authorities for the same residents which will just create inward migration

LPA01 Presumption in Favour of Sustainable Development

I support Policy the Presumption in Favour of Sustainable Development but I am concerned that some policies in the Submission Draft will not support Policy LPA01, such as over-planning for jobs and homes based on flawed assumptions and evidence that is not just

②

LPA02 Spatial Strategy

In setting out this very ambitious strategy for St Helens there is one notable omission from the Submission Draft Spatial Strategy. This is the failure to highlight the great importance government attached to Green Belts. The "essential characteristics of Green Belts are their openness and their permanence". The Submission Draft Spatial Strategy (Policy LPA02, page 17) makes no mention of the "great importance" of Green Belt, their essential characteristics or purposes.

I understand that "exceptional circumstances" need to be demonstrated to release land from Green Belt. I cannot see anywhere in the Submission Draft where "exceptional circumstances" have been demonstrated.

③

LPA04 A Strong and Sustainable Economy

The Submission Draft suggests that St Helens growth trends are significantly higher than historic annual growth rates.

The economic outlook in the Submission Draft is based on out of date forecasts and employment growth is highly aspirational and optimistic. It is relying almost entirely on significant growth of logistic warehousing and does not take into account that warehousing jobs will be at risk because of future automation. It also does not take into account the influence that Brexit could have on the Liverpool Super Port and employment in transportation and warehousing in the region.

As such I believe that employment growth in the Submission Draft is not objectively assessed need but is out of date and extremely aspirational. It has been used subjectively to create a supply side scenario that is not supported by recent economic data and trends.

④ **LPA05 Meeting St Helens Borough's Housing Needs**

The Submission Draft sets out an ambitious strategy for the Borough over the period 1st April 2016 and 31st March 2035 planning for a minimum 9,234 net additional dwellings, at an average of 486 dwellings per annum which includes releasing land from the Green Belt for 2,172 new homes.

In doing so the Council are using an older ONS forecast (2014) of 486 houses per year being required when the latest estimate produced by the ONS (2016) predicts 383 houses per year are required. Surely, the most up to date figures should be used for something as important as a 15 years plan. If the Council used the more recent figures then there would be no need to release land from Green Belt for housing.

I note the Andy Burnham, the mayor of Greater Manchester, was very recently reported as taking issue with Kit Malthouse the Minister for Housing, over which set of housing projections Greater Manchester should use. Speaking in a parliamentary debate, Mr. Malthouse stated that any planning inspector will accept a "properly evidenced and assessed variation" from the target, adding "If, for example, you have constraints like areas of outstanding natural beauty or Green Belt or whatever it might be, and you can justify a lower number, then an inspector should accept that"

⑤ **LPA06 Safeguarded Land**

I understand that in drawing up new Green Belt boundaries the Council, where necessary, should identify areas of safeguarded land between urban area and the Green Belt in order to meet long term development needs beyond the Local Plan period but make clear that the safeguarded land is not allocated for development at the present time.

The Submission Draft goes further than this by specifically identifying sites, their preferred use and development capacity. This is not consistent with national policy as it is tantamount to allocating sites.

If too much land is allocated all at once, then developers will target that which is most profitable and this tends to be rural fringe sites with high values. This leaves other areas bereft of investment, in St Helens the areas surrounding the town centre where community is most in need of the new housing and investment.

One particular area of Safeguarded Land which I will comment on later is the land referred to in the Submission Draft as "Land South of A580 between Houghtons Lane and Crantock Grove, Windle" known as **8HS**.

⑥ **LPA08 Infrastructure Delivery and Funding**

I'm not entirely sure what the Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP) document is as it doesn't really appear to be a plan at all. It does not provide any solutions to the problems that delivering this Local Plan will bring.

I would be obliged if you would accept this letter as my response to the above proposed Local Plan.

Please note that I am in agreement to the representations made by **St Helens Green Belt Association (SHGBA)** and **Eccleston Community Residents Association (ECRA)** but in addition I would also make the following specific points.

I believe that the Local Plan fails to meet the tests of soundness as set out in paragraph 35 of the National Planning Policy Framework (February 2019) (NPPF) and I also believe that St Helens Borough Council ("the Council") has failed to meet legal and procedural requirements in preparing the Submission Draft and have provided no evidence that they have complied with their Duty to Cooperate. I do not believe that the Local Plan is positively prepared, justified, effective or consistent with National Planning Policy. It is based on out of date forecasts and is extremely aspirational.

In particular I wish to object to the proposed release of Green Belt land under the Local Plan and with particular with reference to the proposed site in Eccleston/Windle referred to as 8HS.

I am not opposed to development in the correct way as I firmly believe that St Helens urgently needs regeneration and development. However, I do not agree that this development should be partly by way of building over 2,172 new houses on Green Belt land.

I also do not agree that there is a need for land to be released from Green Belt land and safeguarded for development in the future.

Need for Houses.

4 I have read through the Local Plan and I cannot see anything that justifies the Council's ambitious belief that there is a need for new homes to be built at the rate of 486 houses per year. In doing so the Council are using an older ONS forecast (2014) when they could instead use the more conservative latest estimate produced by the ONS (2016) which predicts a need for 383 houses per year. If the Council adopted the latest figure there would then be no need to build on Green Belt land.

I appreciate that the Council wish to create new jobs and more employment in St Helens. However, the sort of jobs that would be created under the Local Plan would be low paying jobs and those people fortunate enough to obtain the employment would need to live where there are adequate public services and public transport in place. I therefore believe it would make sense for those homes to be close to the Town Centre rather than in Green Belt areas on the rural edge of the Borough.

Brownfield Sites.

I understand that there are many brownfield sites across St Helens that could be used for housing and employment development before Green Belt sites are released. I believe the Council should develop a strategy so that those sites can be utilised before Green Belt sites. Those sites which are contaminated should have a plan in place to make the land uncontaminated. The developers who wish to build houses in St Helens should only be given the option of Brownfield sites with the cost of cleaning up the sites being borne by the developers.

1 Brownfield sites tend to be closer the Town Centre and already have road infrastructure in place. New homes being built on the sites closer to the Town Centre would mean the residents would have greater access to public transport, both buses and trains, and the services in the Town Centre. I believe developing the Brownfield sites which are closer to the Town Centre would help regenerate the Town Centre.

3 Releasing Green Belt land should be a last resort because when it is released it is lost forever. Developers should not be given the option of building houses on Green Belt land when there are Brownfield sites that could be cleaned up and developed. Cleaning up contaminated land in St Helens in this way would benefit all the residents of St Helens. If developers are allowed to build houses on Green Belt land and make greater profits then there is no incentive for them whatsoever to clean up and develop Brownfield sites.

8HS - Land South of A580 between Houghtons Lane and Crantock Grove, Windle.

As I have already stated I do not believe that there is a need in the future for an additional 486 new homes per year in St Helens. Further if there is a need for some new homes I believe they should be developed in and close to St Helens Town Centre by developing unused Brownfield sites and vacant buildings. I believe this would help regenerate St Helens Town centre.

I therefore believe that the land known as 8HS should **not** be released from Green Belt and should **not** be developed on and the Council should reconsider their Local Plan in relation to that land for the following reasons:

- 6
1. **Housing in Eccleston.** Eccleston has already provided its fair share of housing in recent years, with the most recent example being the 262-home development on the former Triplex site. The developers of that site have still not been able to sell all of the new houses and a number remain unsold and unoccupied.
 2. **Road Infrastructure.** The above new development in Eccleston has already put local infrastructure under great strain. The roads in and around the Eccleston area are already congested and are inadequate to support existing traffic levels never mind increased traffic levels. 1,027 new homes on this site alone could increase the number of vehicles in the locality by approximately 1,900.
 3. **Traffic Congestion.** Story Homes, developers who wish to develop this site, suggest access to this new development would be from a new junction where Houghtons Lane meets the A580. If a new junction was created then there would be approximately 1,900 cars exiting on to the A580 on a stretch of road which already backed up at peak times. Further if any of the new residents wished to travel into St Helens (which I am sure the Council would hope would happen) then they would have to travel east on the A580 and attempt to turn right at Windle Island. It is widely known and accepted that Windle Island at present cannot manage

Conclusion.

As I have stated I accept and support the Council in the need to regenerate and develop St Helens. I also appreciate that it is difficult for them but I would like to believe that when considering the Local Plan that the Council will listen to and take on board the views of the many residents in St Helens and in particular residents of the areas directly affected by the Local Plan. (3)

I firmly believe for the reasons that I have stated that the Council should not release any Green Belt land but instead should develop Brownfield sites and vacant buildings closer to the Town Centre. It seems illogical not to develop unused Brownfield sites and vacant buildings in this way which would clearly benefit the people of St Helens far greater than St Helens losing prime Green Belt land which would then be lost forever. (6)

I have already stated that I believe that Eccleston has already provided its fair share of housing in recent years. To release such a large area of Green Belt land at 8HS in Eccleston and Windle will reduce the attractiveness of the area and change the character of the area. This would be a significant loss of Green Belt land which is not only enjoyed by Eccleston residents but also residents of St Helens generally. (2)

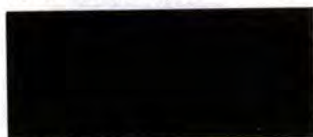
If the development on the land at 8HS was to proceed there would be substantial over development in the Eccleston area which the existing road infrastructure and services would be unable to support. The local schools, doctors, dentists and other key services are already oversubscribed and would be unable to meet the demand of all the new residents. (6)

It is clear that financial contributions for education and off-site highway works are very likely to be required if 8HS was developed and there may be further requirements subject to detailed assessment of infrastructure needs. It is extremely worrying that the Council seems to have selected 8HS for such a large development without first fully identifying the needs and addressing fully how they will be met and funded. It is totally irresponsible to consider releasing Green Belt land to enable developers to develop on without first looking at the long term costs and detrimental effects to the locality and St Helens generally. (1)

I would urge the Council to reconsider their Local Plan with a view to creating a Plan which would help regenerate the Town Centre and also protect the Green Belt and attractiveness of it for the residents of St Helens and their future generations. (2)

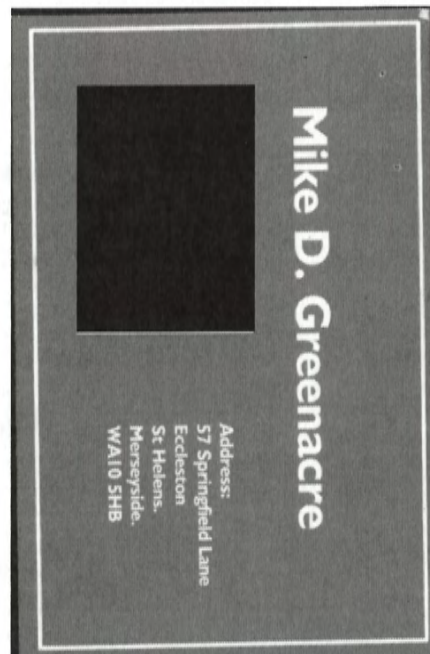



I am a resident of Eccleston [REDACTED]

Since the issue of the original St Helens plan in December 2016 I have been heavily involved in supporting Eccleston Community Residents Association, ECRA {ecra.org} in its campaign against the unnecessary plans by the Council to reclaim large swathes of Green Belt land across the Borough, particularly affecting Eccleston, primarily for housing development.

I am aware that a number of very detailed and extensive representation documents have been submitted from ECRA. These documents have a significant amount of facts and figures and DATA so I do not intend to replicate all of that but only use certain key statistics to emphasise a point where necessary. The 3 submissions relate to an overall response document supported by a submission on the Economy and a submission on the impact relating to the demographic status within the borough. I fully support their content

In the following pages I will layout my own reasons for opposing the revised

ST HELENS LOCAL PLAN SUBMISSION DRAFT {LPSD}

In doing so I would wish to make it clear that I fully support the need for St Helens to develop an overall plan for the town which has seen a long period of decline in skilled jobs primarily brought about by the significant withdrawal from coal mining and glass production over a number of years past.

However I strongly oppose the revised plan, which is based on wildly optimistic forecasts for employment and jobs, thus predicting dramatic forecasts for increased population and therefore creating false demand for excessive new housing requirements forming a key part of this revised plan. ①
②

OVERVIEW

There are a number of key fundamental factors that make the LPSD a flawed plan. In the following pages I have tried to focus on these key factors but with brief mention on other elements that support the case against the LSPD. Again it is important to emphasise that I support the need for a development plan but this revised plan has taken little or no account of residents views and is not based on genuine need that is sustainable nor justified because of the use of biased and exaggerated data that has been used to create this plan in its current format rather than have data that informs the plan

DEFENDING OUR GREEN BELT

- From the original plan and following consultation over 5500 residents submitted their views of which over 90% were against the plans strategy.
- A number of campaign Groups were formed to campaign against the plan where significant tranches of Green Belt {GB} land were being proposed for mainly housing development.
- ECRA alone has over 1000 members as defined on its Facebook site which is by invitation only
- ECRA has an active website that was set up to keep local residents informed about progress, actions and outcomes – ecra.org . The site also highlights ECRA's professional approach by the appointment of **highly qualified Planning, Demographic and Economic specialist's** in support of its opposition against the LPSD.
- I am strongly opposed to Industrial and Housing Development on GB land where it can be clearly demonstrated that the need doesn't exist and where to remove such GB land even to a "Safeguarded" status at this time is completely unnecessary.

KEY OBJECTIONS TO SHLPSD

1. The need to co-operate fully with other local councils appears not to have been followed and no statement showing common ground is in evidence
2. There is a standard method for calculations that can only be varied by the justification of "exceptional circumstances". I do not believe this plan has demonstrated there are any.
3. The fundamental Economic strategy is based on significantly over optimistic assumptions, using out of date forecasts to justify the Councils assertion that there is a clear need to include Green Belt land in its longer term plan both now and beyond 2035. The main ECRA submission deals with this in detail and concludes there is no justification for changing GB boundaries.

4. The current Brown Field register, only created in the past 18 months does not have listed any contaminated Brown Field space despite the fact that pockets of such land are only mildly contaminated. Neither Councils nor Developers want to bear the costs of bringing such land back into use.
5. Little account seems to have been taken of the decreases in population that have occurred over the past 38 years.

In 1981 191'000 people resided in St Helens and by 2011 this figure had bottomed at 176'000 – minus 14'000 people.

This figure has remained almost static for the past few years with only marginal increases up to 2018 to 179'000. If account is taken of this revised plan as it stands the projected increase in population during the next 15 years to 2035 is a massive increase which history – the past 38 years - would suggest is a pipe dream. Indeed the ONS bulletin December 2018 forecasts that population growth by 2041 will have reached 187'000 – plus 8000 over the next 22 years and a significant part of that relates to single occupancy growth and the fact that people are continuing to live longer – not a significant increase in the actual working population.

Taking account of these key objectives St Helens Council should have to amend their revised plan by retaining current GB land {returning land that has been removed from GB and reclassified as "Safeguarded"} because the data they have used to justify their aspirations is based on exaggerated forecasts for new jobs, subsequent population increases and therefore the need for the housing numbers they are forecasting.

Indeed it is likely if these forecasts etc. are not thought through and revised to more sensible levels then it could fail both the legal and soundness tests that it is obligated to achieve.

ECONOMIC AND GROWTH TRENDS -

1. In this plan the forecasted economic growth trends are way above historic growth rates and exceptionally optimistic. They appear to be based on the continued growth of logistical warehousing and distribution. This is in direct competition with the likes of Warrington and Liverpool along side the M62 and the A580 – East Lancs dual carriageway so even on historical annual growth rates I cannot see how this can be deemed to be "Objectively Assessed Needs"
2. Clearly the types of jobs in this sector are relatively low skilled and contained by the ever-growing use of automation. Conversely the development and revival of a higher paid skilled work force is unlikely to form a key part of this plan. Even if the current aspirations for population growth based on new industries in or around the town were achievable then this would not necessarily result in significant increase in population growth. For example the recently announced plan for a proposed £70

million Glass Futures facility which is good news will attract only around 50 new jobs albeit highly skilled research roles. Immigration into the town would be a necessity but historically there is evidence that immigration has always been at a very very low level into the borough. The competition from other towns along the M62 and A580 corridors with similar business strategies will provide intense competition for new employees necessary to meet those ambitious objectives.

POPULATION GROWTH – Based on increased job creation forecasts

It can clearly be seen from the LCRCA SHELMA that St Helens new planned growth targets for jobs in the 15 year period is more than 4 times the current baseline growth. Comments from the SHELMA draft executive summary – “quite aspirational in nature” – para 5.3!!!

HOUSING NEED –VERSUS LAND AVAILABILITY

Based on population growth required to support new jobs

1. In creating the new plan the Strategic Housing Land Allocation Assessment only 2 years ago in 2017 suggested that around 7500 houses would be required over the 15 year plan period.
2. It suggested that 77% of the requirement – 5550 homes - would be developed on Brown-Field sites currently on the register. In fact the Brown-Field register suggested that it could provide just over 5800 homes {March 2017}
3. In assessing land availability it is important that the differences between Brown-Field; Brown-Field contaminated and Unsuitable sites are clearly distinguished. This is in addition to GB sites that maybe released for development – no longer “Safeguarded” because of “exceptional circumstances”

- There is little indication as to how the new plan will deal with the demand for additional school places – trying to cope with thousands more children. (3)
- Flooding has also been identified as a potential hazard on the 8HS site although I would believe that this could be overcome. Again this is covered in more detail in the ECRA submission. (3)
- Then there is the impact on wildlife if Green Belt land is allowed to be developed. Again this is covered in the ECRA documents

SUMMARY OF KEY ISSUES WITH THE REVISED SHLPSD

There are a significant number of key issues that have not been answered by the new LPSD. It is all very fine to have the aspirations that form the core of this new plan for growth but the devil lies in the detail and there is not enough detail to provide any certainty that this plan will deliver over the 15 year period.

A far more realistic approach must be taken – yes to positively grow the town and re-develop its economy – but with goals that are achievable, meets the aspirations of residents already living here, creates an environment that feels like a good place to live and one that retains and respects the green spaces around the town without restricting a realistic growth and development strategy.

These are my summary considerations that support my view that the current revised LPSD should not be approved in its current form.

1. There is clear evidence that the plan is not Legally Compliant
2. The plan fails to fully comply with the Duty to Cooperate - cross border collaboration. (4)
3. The plan is not justified nor will it be effective based on the current exaggerated aspirations based upon using incorrect current data (122)
4. Significantly there are a number of areas where the plan is not consistent with NPPF 2018 guidelines
5. The whole question of Sustainability whether it be transport or houses is conflicted and somewhat vague as well as being based on highly aspirational goals for employment thus population growth and hence the need for very significant housing development. (122)
6. The plan has economic growth predictions – job increases – based on unachievable targets driven again by using historical data. There is undoubtedly room for growth in employment resulting in increased population but nowhere near the predicated targets. The current population of the town has remained almost static for at least 8 years. [1981 population 191'000; 2011 population 176'000] (1)
7. The plan's assessment of Housing Need requirements does not use Standard Methodology to arrive at its forecast and then fails to justify a (2)
