Activity of the Week – Game of Stones!

There are so many things to do with stones. This week, when you are out in your garden or going for a walk see how many stones you can collect.

Here are some suggestions for things you could do with the stones you find.

Stone Stacks

Build a tower of stones. Remember to put the bigger stones near the bottom so that the tower doesn't fall down!

Could you make people out of stones?
You could make a whole stone family!
These stone men are known as Inuksuk in Canada.

Create your own Rock Band

Find two pebbles and tap them together to create a simple rhythm.

Can you copy somebody else's rhythm?

Can you make different sounds by dropping pebbles into different containers?

Next put small pebbles in a pot to make a shaker. Remember to fix the lid on so your pebbles don't fall out!

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Stone pictures

Make a picture out of stones. Maybe you could leave it in front of your house to make people smile as they walk past!



Pebble Toss

Create a hole or use a bucket. Each player needs 5 stones. Take it in turns to toss a pebble into the hole. Can you count how many stones you got into the hole? The person with the most stones wins.

Treasure Trails

Make a trail of stones that lead to something interesting. Put a little surprise at the end to let others know they've found the spot!

Which Hand?

Hide a pebble in one of your hands. Hold out both fists. Let a friend guess which hand the pebble is in. Take turns and let your friend hide the pebble in one of their hands too.

Returning Rocks

Go for a walk and collect stones. Then go back and try and remember where they all came from!

Pebble Pets

Can you turn your stone into a stone pet? Or make Some Rock Bugs to leave in the garden?



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Pebble painting

Using water and a paintbrush you can decorate the stones, or paint patterns, numbers or letters onto them. This is a never ending activity, because you can start again when the stones are dry!

How do you feel?


ABC DOES...
