

Riding the bus will be different



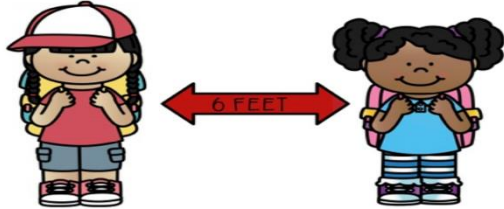
a covid-19 related story

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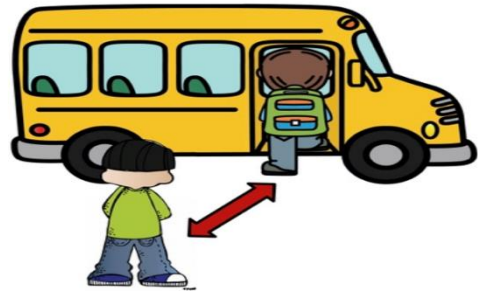
Because of Coronavirus (or COVID-19), riding the bus will be a little different this year.
